

INTRODUCTION

Ewanrigg Junior School is committed to ensuring all children are safeguarded and that pupil welfare is paramount. As a consequence, we will:

- ❖ Establish and maintain an ethos where children feel secure and are listened to with an open and positive school atmosphere.
- ❖ Ensure that children know that there are 'trusted adults' in school who they can approach if they are worried or in difficulty.

- ❖ Include in the curriculum activities and opportunities for PSHE, drugs education and circle time which equip children with the skills they need to stay safe from all forms of abuse.
- ❖ Will make any referrals necessary to ensure the well being of a pupil is safeguarded.
- ❖ Ensure that children’s identities and images are protected with regard to published information, particularly on web sites and in the media.
- ❖ Ensure that the school is always a safe environment.

ACTION

Staff in Ewanrigg Junior School are in a good position to keep a keep a watchful eye on children and their safety and to protect them from abuse and neglect. If they have concerns they must inform the designated safeguarding lead (Miss Craig) immediately.

EXPECTATION

“School expects parents, staff and others working or volunteering in school to support the school’s approach to e-safety and not upload or post to the internet any pictures, videos or text that could upset, offend or threaten the safety of any member of the school community or bring the school into disrepute.”
