Aims and ambitions

Skills

Throughout the Key Stage children are taught a breadth of skills in discussion and the impact of religious beliefs and how this relates to their own lives and experiences. These skills will develop in complexity over the 4 years at Ewanrigg Junior School.

Adaptive Teaching

Though Discovery RE is a useful tool for curriculum delivery. It requires adaption to ensure that it meets every learners needs and is accessible to all.

At the start of each topic, teachers adapt planning to the needs of their class. This may involve the use of technology so children can access learning.

<u>Assessment</u>

Pupils will complete a self assessment of their learning after each unit.

Teachers will monitor children's reflections, knowledge and critical thinking of religions.
