

How Ewanrigg Junior School have spent the PE Government funding 2013-2014?

- **paying the most effective teachers an enhanced allowance to lead improvements in PE and school sport and provide staff training on how to teach PE well**

Sports leader has held 5 INSET training afternoons on the new PE curriculum – Practical lessons ideas, planning the curriculum for PE.

- **employing specialist PE teachers or qualified coaches to work alongside teachers in lessons to increase their subject knowledge and confidence in PE**

Ewanrigg has paid a tennis coach, cricket coach and multi skills coach to come into Ewanrigg and work alongside the teaching staff in their PE lessons. All the coaches are aware and use the national curriculum and are not just sport based.

- **employing a specialist teacher or providing professional development for staff to lead after-school sports clubs for disabled pupils and those with special educational needs**

Specialist boxing and zumba instructor providing after school clubs for children every week.

Cover staff to release teachers for professional development in PE and sport INSET days.

Cover to release PE leader to observe teachers and dinner ladies on the impact of the PE and sport on the children.

- **paying staff or external sports coaches to run competitions, or to increase pupils' comes and delivers after school clubs, special educational need children attend.**

Coaches provided throughout the year quality-assured professional training for staff to raise their confidence and competence in teaching PE and sport in tennis, cricket and multi skills. All children have access to these coaches.

- **participation in national school games competitions**

Children have been involved in a variety of competitions throughout the day. The money has been to release staff and cover transport costs. The competitions are; netball, hockey, tennis, tag -rugby, gymnastics, multi skills, cricket and football.

- **quality assuring the work of sports coaches and instructors employed to coach in PE lessons and after-school sports clubs**

Sports coaches employed to work with classes in set blocks for after school and PE lessons in tennis, cricket and multi-skills.

- **buying into existing local sports networks such as school sport partnerships or community sports coaching initiatives**

Talented children to be paid to go to chance camp during the Easter holidays.

- **pooling funding with other local schools to employ a specialist teacher to train existing teachers and teach PE across a cluster of schools**

We have pooled together with the Maryport cluster schools in order to pay for a gymnastic and dance specialist to lead an INSET.

- **employing expert advice to evaluate the school's current strengths and weaknesses in PE and sport, and implement plans for improvement**

INSET day held with PE leader. Strengths and areas to develop for the school. Pupil and staff questionnaires completed to get a view from all sides.

- **providing places for pupils in after-school sport clubs and holiday courses**

Talented children selected to go to chance camp in the Easter holidays.

- **engaging the least active pupils in after school activities, for example 'Change4Life' after school clubs**

Signed up to take part in the Energy club and playmaking training. Initiative to improve dinner times and PE lesson and train up young sport leaders (summer time).

- **providing training and payment for midday supervisors to introduce playground games at breaks and lunchtimes**

Midday supervisors performance management to take place and training will take place as a result of the performance management outcomes. Signed up to take part in the Energy club and playmaking training. Initiative to improve dinner times and PE lesson and train up young sport leaders (summertime).

- **forging links with PE teachers in local secondary schools to help primary staff improve their PE and sports provision**

PLT's (primary Link Teachers) meet every half term with sports coach from the local secondary school.

- **paying for transport, pool hire and instruction to provide additional swimming lessons for those pupils unable to swim by the end of Year 6**

Children have been identified from year 6 and year 5 non swimmers to take part in family swimming with their parents/carers and learning mentor.

- **providing extra, additional activities such as outdoor and adventurous activities**

Horse riding and skiing provided

- **purchasing specialist equipment and teaching resources to develop a non-traditional activity such as rhythmic gymnastics or a new sport such as competitive cycling**

Due to the high rising numbers in the school we had a shortage of gym mats that we couldn't teach effectively so we have bought new gym mats.

- **providing pupils who are gifted and talented in sport with expert, intensive coaching and support.**

Offering a group of year 6 talented children the opportunity to take part in a scholarship during the Easter holidays paid for.
